Dental Hygiene students plan and implement a community dental health program within the community. These programs frequently involve working with children ages 3-10 years of age, within pre-school and elementary school classrooms. In these programs the students provide dental hygiene brushing and flossing instruction to the children, as well as nutritional education. The Dinosaur Dental Puppets will provide a fun and interactive way for the students to provide brushing and flossing instruction with the children. Interactive teaching methodologies has been proven to be the most effective, and the Dental Puppet can help increase this interaction.
